The 43rd General Council on June 20 received the proposal <u>Towards an Anti-Racist Denomination</u>. The proposal asks us to demonstrate our commitment, through analysis, and a series of initiatives to get rid of bias and racism.

Any action needs to have integrity and time for deep reflection. That was not possible in the two-hour window time of the meeting. The matter was referred to the General Council Executive. It will report on this work to the 43rd General Council when it meets in October.

This proposal came to the General Council meeting held just days after the Executive's <u>Statement that Black Lives</u> <u>Matter</u> was released. The proposal states:

Public statements are not enough. Words are not enough. This is a moment for The United Church of Canada to wrestle with its white privilege, its role in systematizing anti-Black racism within its own policies, procedures, and practices, and its role within the wider Canadian context. There is a need to make becoming an anti-racist denomination and dealing with anti-Black racism within our denomination a missional priority at all levels of the denomination.

This proposal is now added to the work of the Executive's Working Group on Anti-racism. The working group is also looking at revisions to the United Church's <u>harassment policy</u> to strengthen its application to racialized people, and has requested that additional opportunities be provided for racial justice training in the church.

The Working Group on Anti-racism will work alongside the White Privilege Working Group to review the elements of the proposal, to set priorities and actions to address racism within the United Church and our society.
